A Word From Pastor Bruce Wilson

In this small community, it's quite common for me to encounter members of the body of Christ who, for any number of reasons, don't seem to make it to worship very often on Sunday mornings. When I see these folks out and about town, I always enjoy saying hello and briefly catching up on their lives. But what is interesting to me, is how often they take the conversation to a place of explaining and justifying their absence from worship. I guess it's just part of having the job title of 'Pastor' attached to my name that folks think I am grading them on their worship attendance.

Trust me. I am not keeping track. That being said, I do care about everyone's faith journey and I believe being present in active worship with other Christ-followers is irreplaceable with any other method of spiritual formation. Yes, our time with God in quiet devotion, prayer, Scripturereading and study is all wonderful. These practices aid in spiritual growth and maturity, but they aren't meant to

replace worship. And watching church on TV is better than nothing, I suppose, but it's no match for the live experience and real human interaction with other worshippers.

As you embark on a brand new year, I encourage you to elevate your commitment to being an active part of a real live worship service. Of course, I would love to see you worship with me at Anthony UMC. But really, go and worship wherever God is calling you to go. It is vitally important to God. Throughout Scripture, worship is a central act of the Christian Life. You see, we are created for worshipping God. It is doesn't have to make sense to you. You don't have to always feel like it. It's not about you. It's about God, and He really likes it. There-

fore, we should make every effort to do it every week. Psalm 95:6 says: "Come, let us bow down in worship; let us kneel before the Lord our Maker." Friends, there are so many reasons why entering into worship on a regular basis can be hard for any one of us... including me. Maybe you don't understand why it's important. Maybe for you it's a struggle at this season of your life. But the cool thing is, it really doesn't matter what we think or feel about worship, because it is something God asks of us. 
SMALL GROUP STUDY TO BEGIN JANUARY 21



<u>SET</u>—your mind on things above.

"Set" in this context means "to seek." Look at ife from Christ's perspective. Search for Him daily! Seek God each morning and ask Him to direct your steps for the day. Try memorizing some verses to help shift your focus on Him. Make sticky notes with scriptures and put them on your bathroom mirror!

- * Finally, brothers and sister, whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable-if anything is excellent or praiseworthy—think about such things. Phil. 4:8
- * Do not conform to the pattern of tis world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is—his good, pleasing and perfect will. Rom. 12:2

SLAY—the sin in your life.

This can be easier said than done! Remember in these verses Paul is speaking to believers. Chances are what people typically think of as "big sins" may not be happening in your life... but how's your temper? Do you speak the truth? Obscene speech? Gossip? If your being honest, some of those will make you say "Ouch!"

SURRENDER—to the word of God

If you are a believer, there should be an outward difference in your life. If you take a look at Col. 3:12-14, it shows what qualities, as believers, we should display. Above all of these, we should show love. Surrender to God's word and love people just as Jesus did!

SERVE—others

Our sinful nature can really take away from serving others. We tend to justify why we shouldn't serve another person but Col. 3:17 encourages us that whatever we do or whomever we are serving, we are doing it for the Lord.
