

A Word from Pastor Bruce Wilson



Have you ever been faced with a situation that seemed impossible? I know I have. Quite often, actually. And if I'm not careful, when I get the feeling of facing an insurmountable circumstance, I start to complain. My thoughts turn negative, I get irritated by life, and I lose desire for the important work of sharing the gospel and loving others around me.

Fortunately, I am careful most of the time. The key to success is spending time in God's Word daily. For example, a verse like "With people it is impossible, but not with God; for all things are possible with God (Mark 10:27)," protects me from so much wasted time in worry and negativity.

Recently, I read a devotion from Dr.

Charles Stanley that addresses what we should do in seemingly impossible situations. When you encounter a difficult situation in life that looks impossible, what is the first thing you think? For most people, it is, "Oh Lord, what am I going to do?"

But that's the wrong question. Instead, the right thing to ask is, "Lord, what are YOU going to do?" Because, as we are well aware, He is all-powerful, and nothing is too challenging for Him.

Of course, all of us know this in our minds. But often, when our back is against the wall and we don't know where to turn, we become gripped by the immensity of our predicaments and the disconcerting details that accompany them. It's natural for us to immediately envision the worst-case scenarios and how helpless we are with our limited resources. We become trapped by what we see and hear rather than recall Who comes to our aid.

This is why we must train ourselves to look to the Lord rather than our circumstances. Because when we invite the supernatural, powerful presence of the living God to take hold of our situation, He deals with our difficulties in ways far beyond our imagination. He can get us to the right solution regardless of what we face.

When we are amid those seemingly im-

possible situations, God desires for us to cast our care on Him (1 Peter5:7). Casting our care onto Jesus isn't just simply about expelling them from our life. It's about committing them into the capable hands of our loving Father, trusting Him with the situation. You can simply pray instead of worrying, "Lord, I cast my anxieties on you, because you care about me." Are you ready to completely trust God with every situation you face today? Great. Then join me in praying, "Jesus, I fix my eyes on you. I am grateful that my challenges are no match for you. And I look forward to testifying to the marvelous ways you will resolve, transform, and heal my situation for your glory and my good. In Jesus Name. Amen."




