A Word from Pastor Bruce Wilson

Curt presented a devotion based on Matthew 225 encouraging us to make room in our daily life for God's plan. The Wesleyan Mission and Vital Signs were reviewed. Summer activities upholding the mission were VBS, summer food program, and the sermon series on James. A discussion about Little Lambs, Higher Grounds & Leather Bound youth group, and AUMC youth and best way to identify and address unmet needs. Pastor Bruce will visit with AUMC parents and Bryan Hilgemann about the HGLB youth. Charlie will contact Hazel's for more information about the 3 units that were not running properly.


