## A Word From Pastor Bruce Wilson

For the month of January, I challenged parishioners to assess their habits, both good and bad. As Christians, we know in our hearts and minds that following God's will in our daily choices is the best way to experience His abundant blessings and enjoy life. However, year after year, we hold onto habits which, whether we recognize it or not, celebrate our own selfish ways of living. This can be true in any area of life, and it's certainly true in our food culture. Daily, we choose to eat when we are not hungry. We choose foods that are convenient and processed because they are

ready-to-eat and chemically formulated to tantalize our taste buds. We chase that feeling of "full satisfaction" as we eat many bites past the point of the Holy Spirit's prompting to stop. We choose foods for emotional reasons... to alleviate stress or relational discomfort. We eat like we don't believe God will provide for us the next time we are hungry. Overall, we leave God out of our food choices because we believe we are perfectly capable of handling food without His help. And when we choose to disobey God, in any area of life, food or otherwise, we are unfortunately choosing a most difficult future for ourselves. I am not pointing fingers, I struggle daily to place Jesus into the center of my choices. But I am also here to testify. The more I trust Him and choose to follow His lead, the more I see how His way of living is the absolute best way for my life. Choosing to disobey Him always leads to disappointment and heartache.

Look, maybe food is not your passion like it is mine. But using examples about food always makes the broader spiritual lesson easier to understand because everyone can relate to a desire to control their own food choices... even my 4 year old. But you can pick any topic and compare it to Jesus. Our Lord Jesus submitted to God's authority in every area of His life and because He did, He was always successful in life and ministry. Shouldn't we follow His

example? I know it feels impossible because He was perfect and we are human. But remember, when you accepted His free gift of salvation, the same resurrection power that rose Jesus from the grave, came to live in you through the power of the Holy Spirit. (Romans 8:11)

Remember: there is no resurrection without crucifixion. The adversity in your life helps you experience Christ's resurrection power. There must be an end to all your self-reliance so that you can rely solely on God before you can see His power flow through you into a new healthy way of living and experiencing Christ's resurrection power. As New Year's resolutions begin to fade into February, be encouraged today. Test your heart. Surrender yourself to God's plan for the habits of your life and celebrate the new you from this day on.

- ▼ Reminder to support our HUMC friends for their Ham & Bean feed Feb. 19.



Learn about these Bible stories at Sunday School or read them together as a family!


#### ADULT SUNDAY SCHOOL CLASSES BEGIN NEW STUDY
